Happy Lacing, see you there! Sylvia


Non Minutes

INVISIBLE ENDINGS

Materials needed: 12 pairs of bobbins for oval, 7 pairs for swan; Size 40/2 cotton, sewing thread to create magic "Lazy Loops."

I would advise winding one bobbin of each pair with a larger amount of thread and about 18 inches on the second bobbin. That way when you finish one pattern you only have to wind a little bit on the second bobbin to start the next one. I know you can all finish at least one pattern, for sure. If you're quick and "get it," I'll even have a third pattern to try.


