Bruges Heart with Julia Brock

8 pair bobbins part 1, 6 pair for part 2 with edging.

12 Finca or 40 Linen thread for larger heart (1 yard per bobbin.) 2 yards per bobbin for worker pairs

80 DMC tatting thread for small heart (1 yard per bobbin) 2 yards per bobbin for worker pairs

2 pair are metallic (optional)

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CROCHET BOBBIN HOLDERS

These crochet holders were made driving in a car on the way to the White Sage lace group with Maria Provencher and Susie Johnson. I didn't want to crochet into the stitch while driving so I decided to crochet around the post which created a ridge on the right side of the work which lets the bobbins lied flat on the pillow. After many request for the instructions I finally decided to write them up.

I usually make the holders to hold 14 to 17 bobbins which makes them easy to stack when working on your pillow.

Materials: A good light color 100% cotton yarn that is smooth and no fuzz. Crochet hook size F - G depending on yarn.

First make a chain the length you want. For eight pairs or sixteen holes you need to crochet 29 + 4 Calculations: 2(number of holes - 1) - 1 then add 4 more chains For 8 pairs: 2(16 - 1) - 1 = 29 + 4 = 33 chains total.

Step 1: Chain 33

Step 2: Double crochet into 5th stitch from end.

(chain 1, skip 1 chain stitch and double crochet into next chain) repeat to the end of chain



Should have 16 holes.

Step 3: Chain 4, turn work, double crochet into the first post, (chain 1 double crochet into next post) repeat to the end. Note last post is a loop.

Step 4: Option 1: Don't turn work! 2 half double crochet (yarn over go into the space pull up loop than go into all three loops) into each space. The corners is 2 half double crochet, 1 chain, 2 half double crochet. Continue around to first space (which is a corner) 2 half double crochet into space slip into first stitch. You can go around a second time going thru stitches instead of space.





Option 2: Same as above except this time do a single crochet instead of a half double crochet. I usually do 3 rounds. This option lays flatter.
