The January 15, 2011 meeting of the Freeway Lace Guild was called to order at 10:13am by President Julia Brock. Guests were:

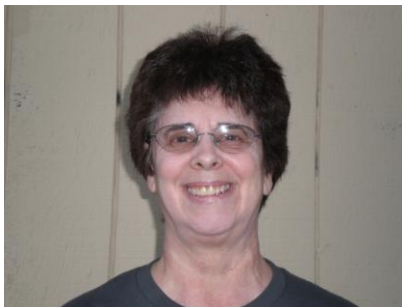

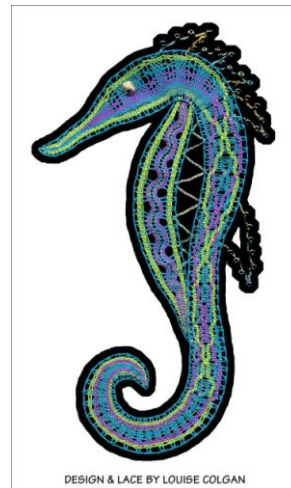
**Hilda Schinhofen...In loving memory  
February 22, '92 - January 6, '11**

Hilda was a member of our guild for about 20 years and started making bobbin lace with Katie Kliot but got comfortable with it when she took regular classes with Maria Provencher. Hilda tried over 20 different forms of bobbin lace and even at the age of 88 she made colliers "necklaces" for her four daughters. Lacemaking was Hilda's favorite textile art but over the years she did lots of weaving of all types, i.e., spinning, needlelace, tating, knitting, macrame, crochet etc. She

was capable in numerous other techniques from stained glass to cloisonné jewelry. In the end, Hilda kept lacemaking and her daughters said that in her sleep, just hours before she passed, she was making the motions as if she was making lace and said out loud, "Only four rows left." We will all miss her cheerful smile and joyful disposition.

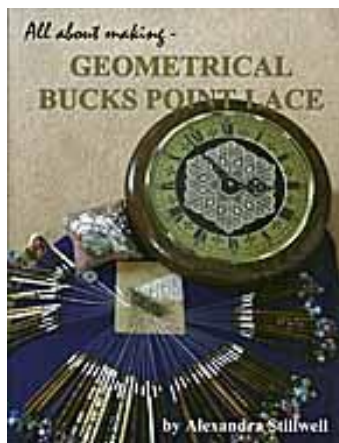

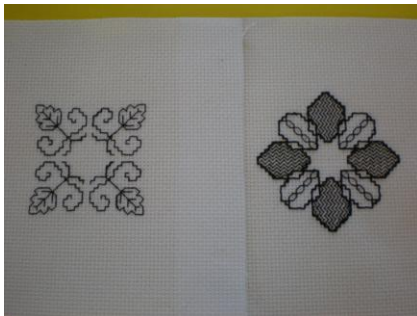
