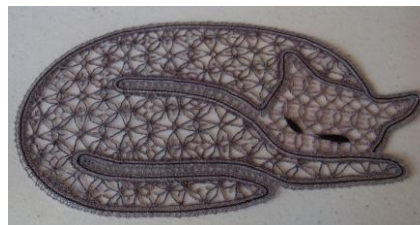

COMMITTEES

Vibs-'sgravenmoere bulb, Austrian rose and several critters; snail, penguin, duck, gecko and mouse.

Lucie-Portuguese knitted cap done with a pulley for tension, purple asymmetrical scarf, patterned scarf, cobweb wool for wedding ring shawl, 2d cat, 'sgravenmoere ornament, bookmark and several butterflies in yellow, purple and a dragonfly. Recovering from surgery ups your lace making time.

We adjourned at 11:15 to lunch, the lily bud class and individual projects.

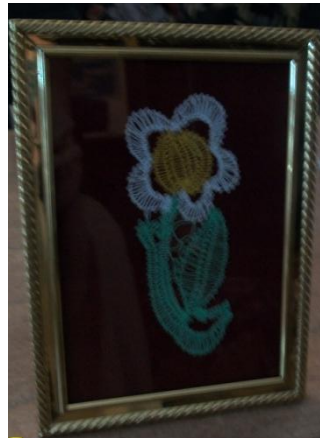

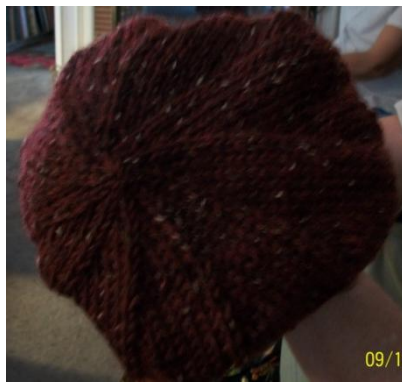

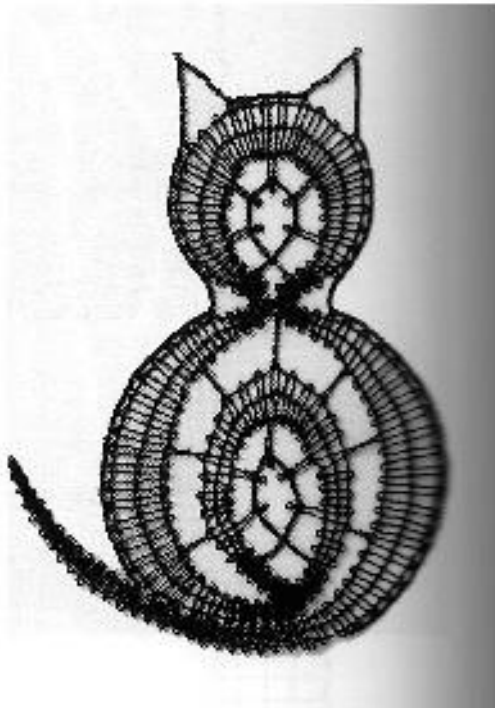

Le Chat "Sooty"

Size 80 cotton thread (Maria and I both recommend doing this pattern in a color OTHER THAN BLACK first...it's really hard to see black thread stitches when working)

6 pairs of bobbins, wound in pairs, 2 yards thread to EACH bobbin

2 pairs bobbins, wound in pairs, 1 yard thread to EACH bobbin

The other usual tools: pillow, scissors, pin pusher, picot pins (if desired), cover cloth with a hole or the plastic cover with a hole.

Stitches used: double stitch, cloth stitch, picots, plaits



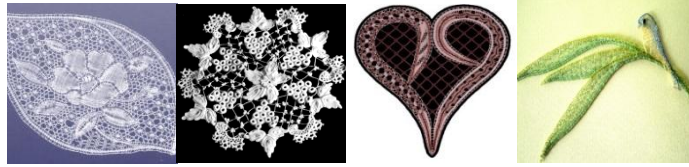

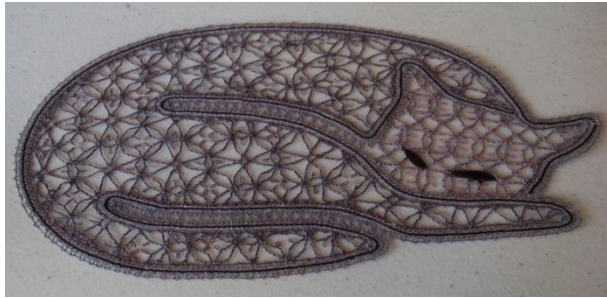
