


Member Bios....


BLOEMWERK FAN

(with plaited filling)



Frame and filling was worked with 40/2 linen.
The scroll was begun with 4 pairs, then 4 additional pairs added before completing the scroll.

Flower – was worked with Londonderry 80/3, using 11 pairs, the plaited/picot filling: (put 1 twist on each pair before working the picot, then 3 twists + 2)



Filling Sequence:
— 1st Pair
— 2nd
— 3rd
— 4th
