The meeting was adjourned at 11:40 to lunch, to be followed by Rosemarie's nametag class.







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Stripey bookmark 28 pairs DMC Special Dentelles 80 In my sample 8A = turquoise, 8B = light blue, 8C = light green, 4D = medium blue







Finishing stripey bookmark

- 1. Work all the pins in the bookmark pricking
- 2. Take the pair from X through 1 pair to the right in half st, leave.
- 2. Take the pair hanging from the next pin through 2 pairs to the right in half st, leave.
- 3. Continue in this way until the right-hand pair at Z has worked through all the pairs to the right in half stitch, leave.
- 4. Take the pair from Y through 1 pair to the left in half st, leave.
- 5. Take the pair hanging from the next pin through 2 prs to the left in half st, leave.
- 6. Continue until the left-hand pair from Z has worked through all the pairs to the left in half stitch, leave.
- 7. The outside pairs are now used to tie the threads together. Knot them together tightly over all the other pairs using a reef (square) knot. Cross them under the bundle of threads and tie again tightly over the threads. Cut off the bobbins leaving ends long enough for a tassel.

Binding the tassel (optional)

Divide threads into two bundles. Find the centre two pairs, take these out under the bundles, back over the top, cross them in the middle and take them out under the bundles again. Finally tie these pairs over the bundle of threads. This can be worked tightly or loosely to give different effects.
