My Dear Lacers:

At last, I'll be able to be back with you all this month! I missed you! Many waters went under the bridge and many fine events have happened, but it's nice to be back to seminormal. Winter Lace Conference was wonderful and I really enjoyed going up to The Lace Museum in January, even though it was raining....beautiful green hills.

This month I will be teaching two ornament decorations in bobbin lace that are designed to go over a glass ball. Francesca is very kindly providing the glass balls for us – all you need to bring is your pillow, lots o' bobbins, and thread. The thread for the green ornament is Guttermann silk sewing thread; you'll need 2 spools. You'll need 30 pairs of bobbins to avoid sewings. If you want to put in beads, you'll need 36 Size 8 seed bead, also a bigger bead with a big hole to finish the tassel. The small beads are an optional extra and don't have to be put in.

The red ornament is size 80 tatting thread. You'll need 12 pairs of bobbins.

I am working on a Christmas ornament lace design to be put on a glass ball which I'll be teaching you in March...giving you plenty of time to get one (or maybe more) done by Christmas, I hope. We should have a grand display at our Christmas party this year.....
